The year commenced with our **JEA Service** held on Sunday January 2nd at St Paul's Church. How good it is when we can all worship Our Heavenly Father together.

Our next meeting will be for leaders (church and home group) to train/study/look at our new evangelism training manual - **Sowing the Seed: Projekt 1**. This will take place at Elim Church, Stopford Road on 16th February at 7.30 p.m. We are praying that many churches will study this manual in preparation for their own evangelistic events.

On 31st October we plan our annual **Children's Event** at a location yet to be finalised.

In December we trust that our **Carol Service** will take place back in the Royal Square. We felt the last one did not sit as well amongst the busyness of the stalls at Liberation Square. The singers and speakers were excellent but got slightly drowned out in that situation.

We are also happy to keep you informed of other events such as **New Wine** from 18th to 20th March at St Paul's Church; **Global Day of Prayer** on 12th June and **Jersey Keswick** 7th - 10th July at St Helier Methodist Centre.
